1925. Four-wheel brakes (B.12 model). All steel monocoque bodies.

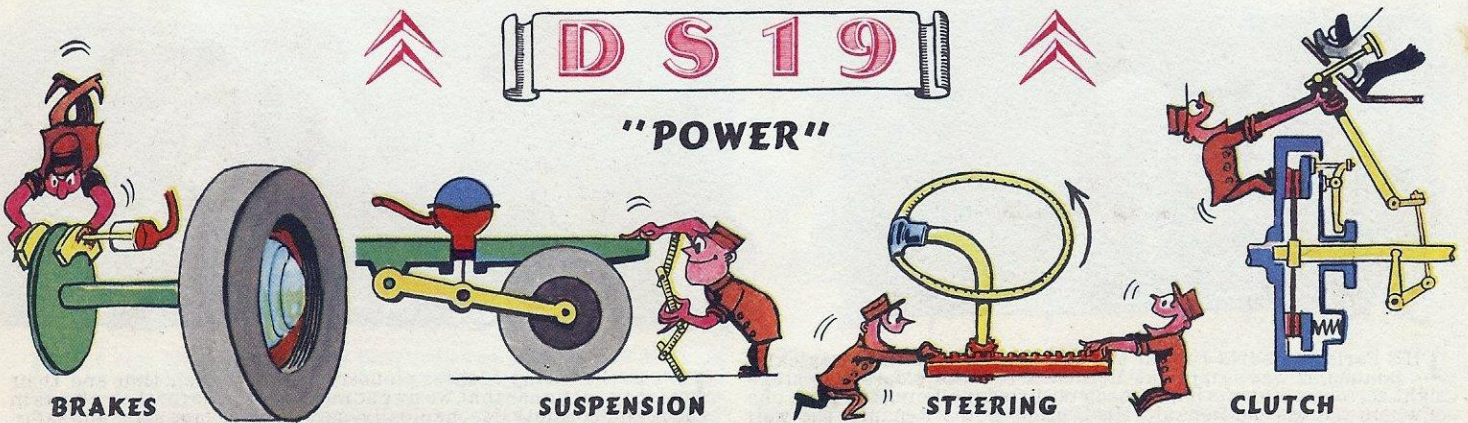
1934. Front wheel drive with its legendary road holding.
